PROJECT SEED GRANT FROM EXXON COMMUNITY SERVICE FUND RECEIVED

PROJECTS IN PROGRESS: DOCUMENTING GLASS, THEATRE AND HISTORY IN DOBBS FERRY

"THROUGH STAINED GLASS": This inprogress Storefront History Theatre episode explores the beauty and diversity of stained and tinted glass in public, private and religious buildings in Dobbs Ferry.

You may have glimpsed project photographer Evelyn Fitzgerald window-watching throughout the village, aiming her camera on all manner of glass. Many of you have already graciously allowed her to photograph stained glass windows from within, looking out through to the community.

ARCHITECTURAL HISTORY:

An elegant booklet, Norcross House:

A History of Its Construction, has been published in January, 1985, by the present owners, Edmund J. and Suzanne McCormick. The book features Carl and Elizabeth Norcross's account of the building's conception and design by John deKoven Hill, president of the Frank Lloyd Wright Foundation, as well as excerpts from Oswald G. Villard's 1939 book, Fighting Years, Memoirs of a Liberal Editor, and an addendum by the McCormicks regarding the restoration of the house between 1968-82.

Edited by Dr. Susan P. Casteras of Yale's British Art Museum, and designed and printed by Sue and Greer Allen of Yale University, this lovely local architectural history now resides in the archives of the Dobbs Ferry Historical Society.

"NOVEL" ARCHAEOLOGY:

Dobbs Ferry author Bette Pesetsky's 1984 fiction, <u>Digs</u> (Alfred A. Knopf), had our director chuckling! It's rare to find a novel which weaves a local historical society into its plot.
